2. Minutes of last meeting	Correct
3. Surgery update	 New GP Jessica Jones New nurses Loraine and Lindsay The new telephone system is now installed and hasn't cost the surgery anything. It is an off the shelf package supplied by the CCG and with a year of free calls. There have been some problems and complaints, but it is hoped to work with the suppliers to iron out problems The magazine racks have been acquired but it is proving difficult to find wall space for them. Any suggestions gratefully received The CQC visit was due but there has been a change of policy and any surgery having received a good report before will only receive a telephone call. There will be a visit next year Wetherby and District Medical and Dental Services (part of the "Better Wetherby Partnership"). Anita is aware of this group, but the surgery has not joined because they want information about new housing, which hasn't happened yet, and it is not her remit to have political views. The other GP practice in Wetherby is a corporately run one. Part of their remit is to expand the practice. They work differently, only have one GP. All their prescriptions are done electronically and sent directly to a pharmacist.

	 The new financial year starts April. From 1.4.19 Primary Care Networks will be set up covering several practices. These PCN's will have 5-year contracts, guaranteed funding and cover 30-50,000 patients. Each PCN will hold funding for nurses, local wound services, home blood tests and staff will cover several practices. Each PCN will have a Clinical Director, one of the Partners, a Practice Nurse or a Practice Manager. The ideal is to have a pharmacy in all surgeries but there are not enough pharmacists trained for this to be possible.
